Public property includes thoroughfares, streets, sidewalks, and parking facilities that are within the campus or immediately adjacent to and accessible from the campus. The following locations were used in preparing data about selected crimes for the "Adjacent Public Property" section of this report. These incidents/arrests occurred on property adjacent to campus. As part of the new amendment to the Jeanne Clery Act, Colleges are now required to report the above listed crime statistics that occur on property adjacent to the College campus. As a result, if the El Paso Police Dept. stops a vehicle on a street adjacent to campus and makes an arrest for drugs, that would count as a statistic for a drug arrest occurring on our campus.
