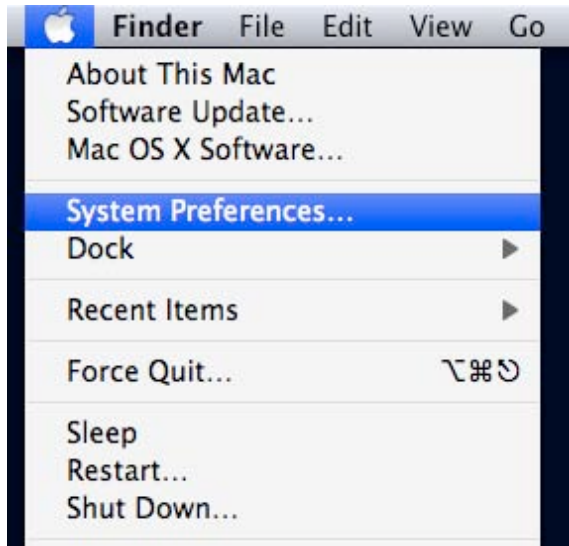


Configuring VPN on Mac OS X 10.5 (Leopard). This process requires administrative access.

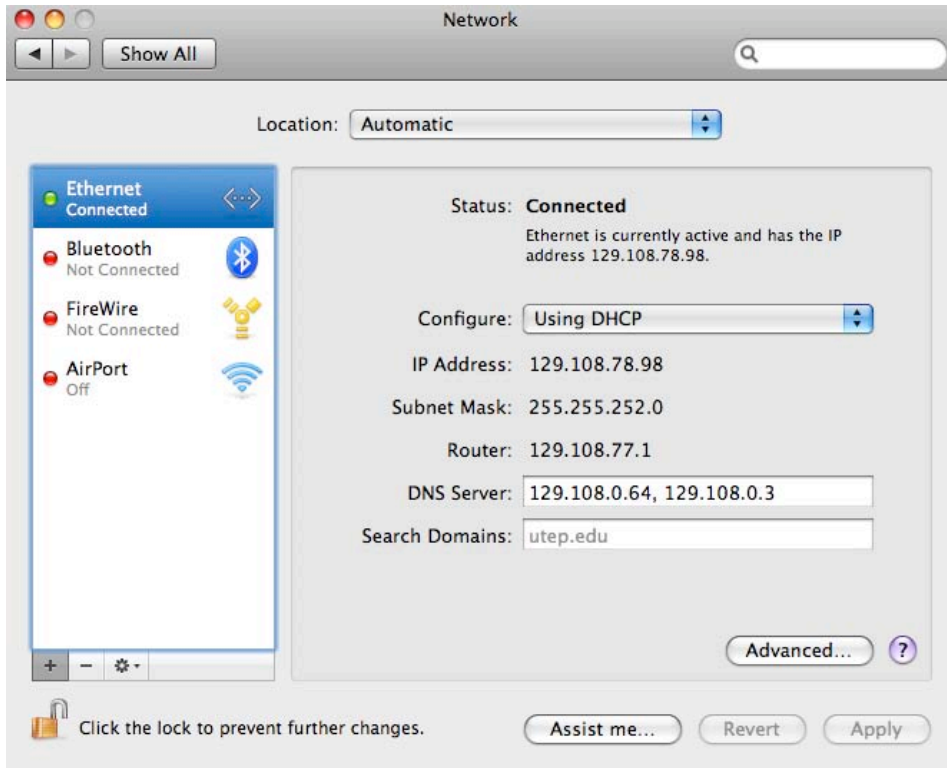
Open **System Preferences**.



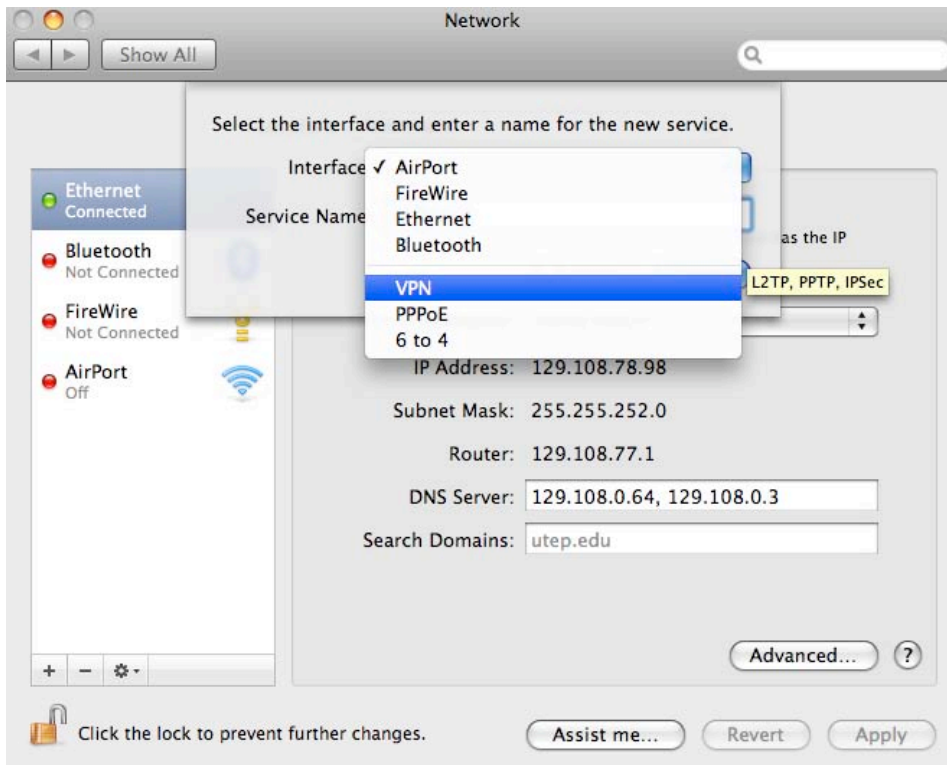
Under **Internet & Network** select **Network**.




On the lower left hand side select the plus sign (+). You may have to unlock the lock for access.



Under **Interface** Select **VPN**.



Set **VPN: Type** to **PPTP**, Under **Service Name:** Type in **UTEP VPN**, and click **Create**



Select the interface and enter a name for the new service.

Interface: VPN

VPN Type: PPTP

Service Name: UTEP VPN

Cancel Create


Type in the following settings:

Server Address: **vpn.utep.edu**

Account Name: **username** (if you email address is [paydirt@utep.edu](mailto:paydirt@utep.edu), your user name is paydirt).

Place a check on **Show VPN status in menu bar**

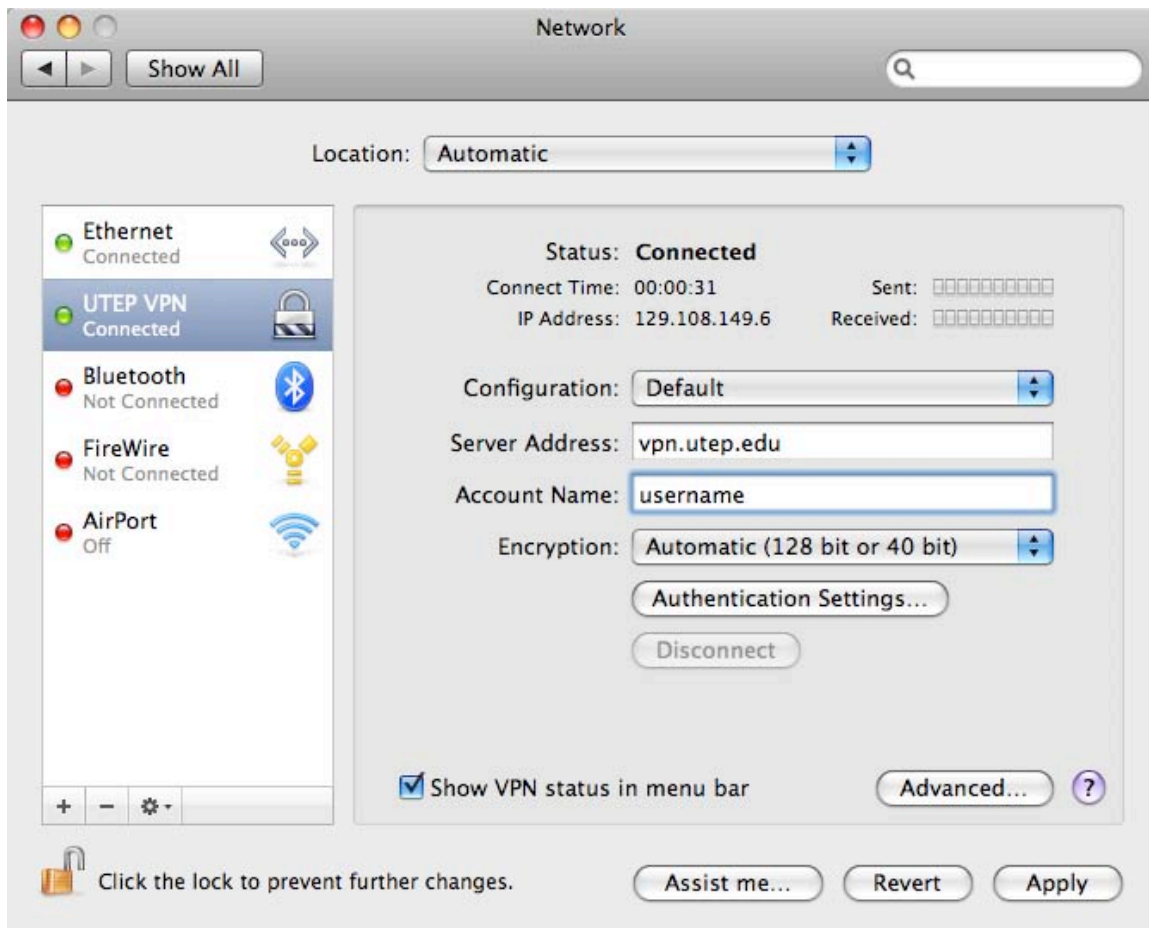
Click the lock to prevent further changes.

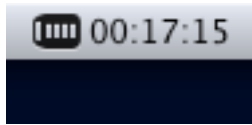
Type in your utep email password.
